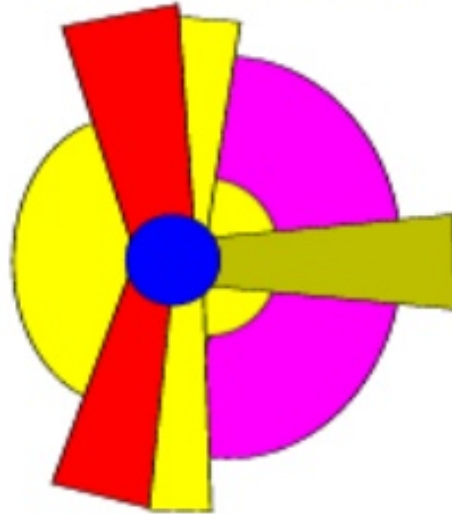







Urban Land Use Models
